These factors have contributed to South Africa winning the 2021 global award for the top location for business services, a testament to its capacity to deliver high-quality ICT solutions.

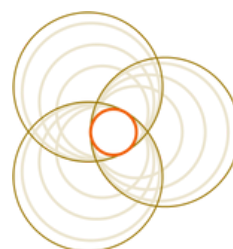
### **A Pan-African Surge in Digital Capability**
